Learning and Development of Undergraduate Students in CSD: B.S. in CSD Assessment Report

Introduction

The BS program in CSD is designed to provide students with a foundation in basic human communication processes, development, and disorders, and a broad-based experience in liberal arts coursework to complement their discipline-specific learning. A hands-on experiential learning experience during the student's senior year in the Gebbie Speech Language and Hearing clinic completes students' preparation for their chosen careers by reinforcing CSD course content and theory. Our assessment efforts are focused on gaining key insights into what students can do, which provides strong evidence of student learning and development, as well as capturing student's attitudes, perceptions, or feelings about their learning and development.


Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs)

- **SLO1** Human Communication Process and Disorders. Identify the developmental norms for speech/language acquisition, the theoretical and scientific foundations of CSD, and general knowledge of speech, language, and hearing disorders.
- **SLO2** Clinical Practices for Communication Disorders. Understand and explain the basic clinical process for the prevention, identification, evaluation, and remediation of communication disorders.
- **SLO3 Critical Thinking.** Apply critical thinking, problem solving, and logical reasoning skills to problems, issues, and/or clinical case studies in communication sciences and disorders.
- **SLO4** Scientific Inquiry and Research Skills. Explain "evidence-based decision making" as a lifelong learning process in communication sciences and disorders.
- Professional Communication Skills. Demonstrate effective professional written communication skills as they pertain to clinical topics and situations in communication sciences and disorders. Demonstrate effective spoken communication skills to explain and describe content and/or research knowledge as they pertain to topics in communication sciences and disorders.
- SLO6 Ethics, Integrity, and Commitment to Diversity and Inclusion. Identify how individual, cultural, and linguistic differences influence speech, language, and hearing and the disorders of communication that individuals may experience. Recognize and explain professional ethical principles in the fields of speech language pathology and audiology.



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Assessment Methods

- Direct measures: Student works, exam grades, case studies, clinical practicum performance, and presentations
- Indirect measures: Exit surveys, reflection papers, and student listening session

Purpose:

- Listen and Discuss: Undergraduate and graduate students are provided the opportunity to express their thoughts, concerns, and/or feelings about current events in our society, in the CSD Department, and/or at Syracuse University.
