Student Engagement

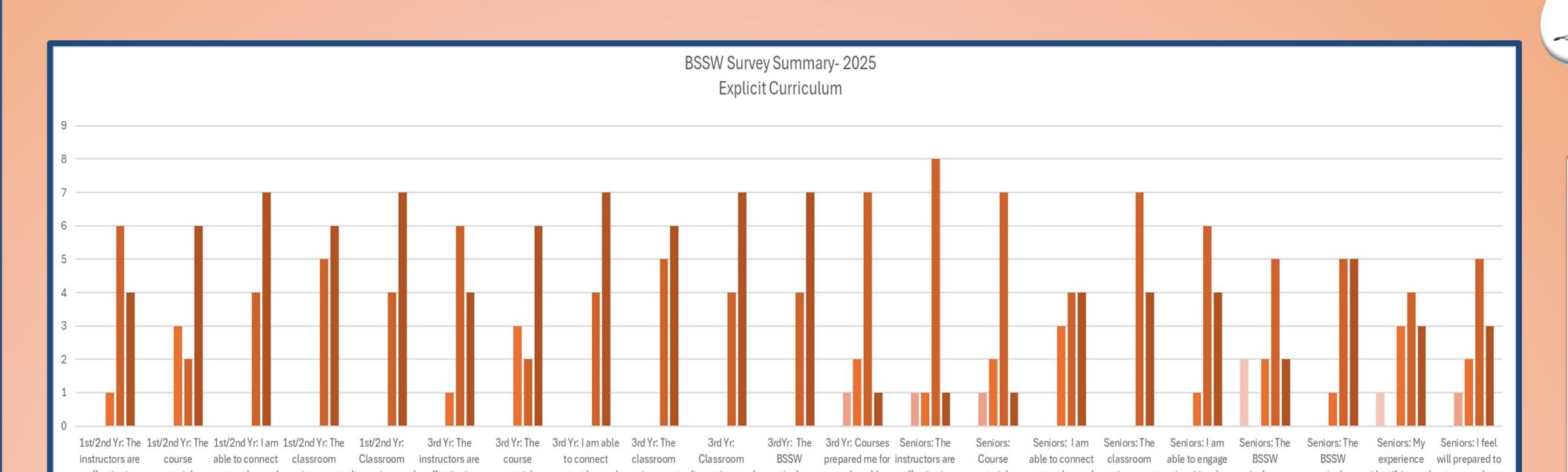
Facilitated two separate targeted focus groups to gather student voice

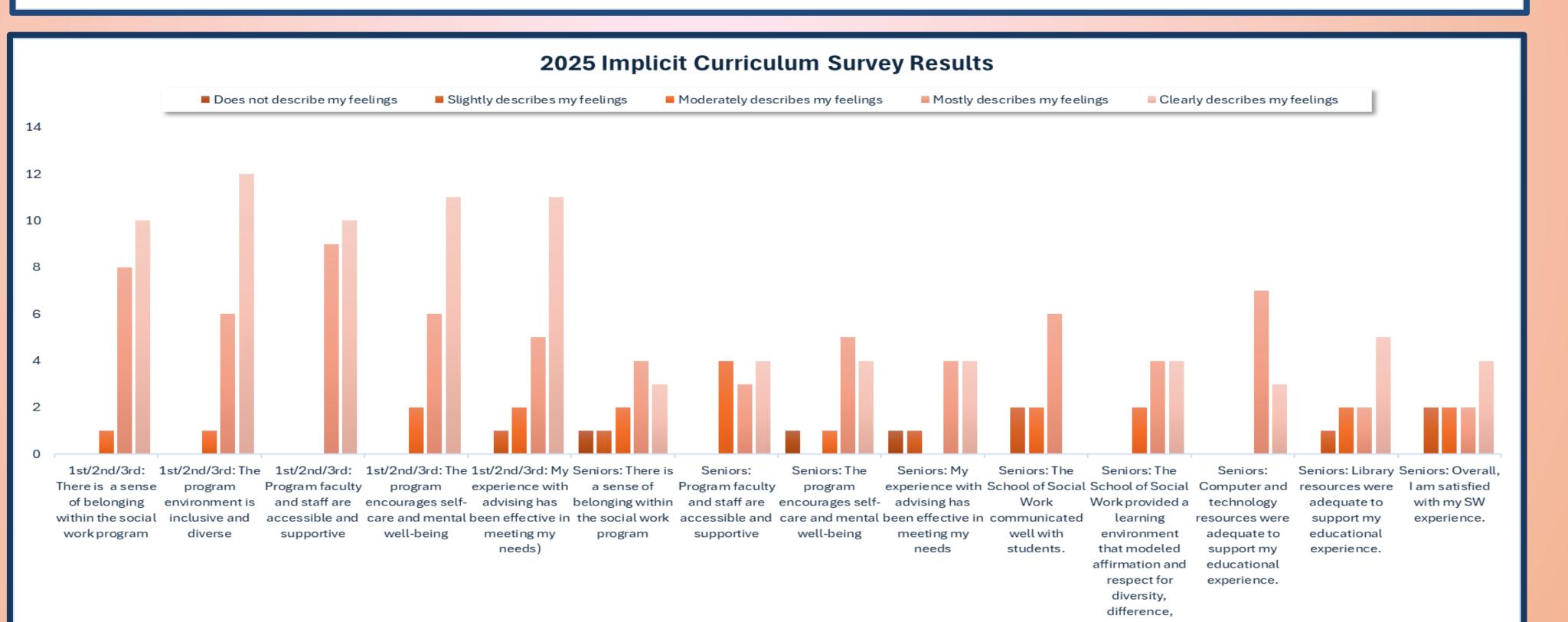
Distributed a comprehensive survey tailored for students based on program year

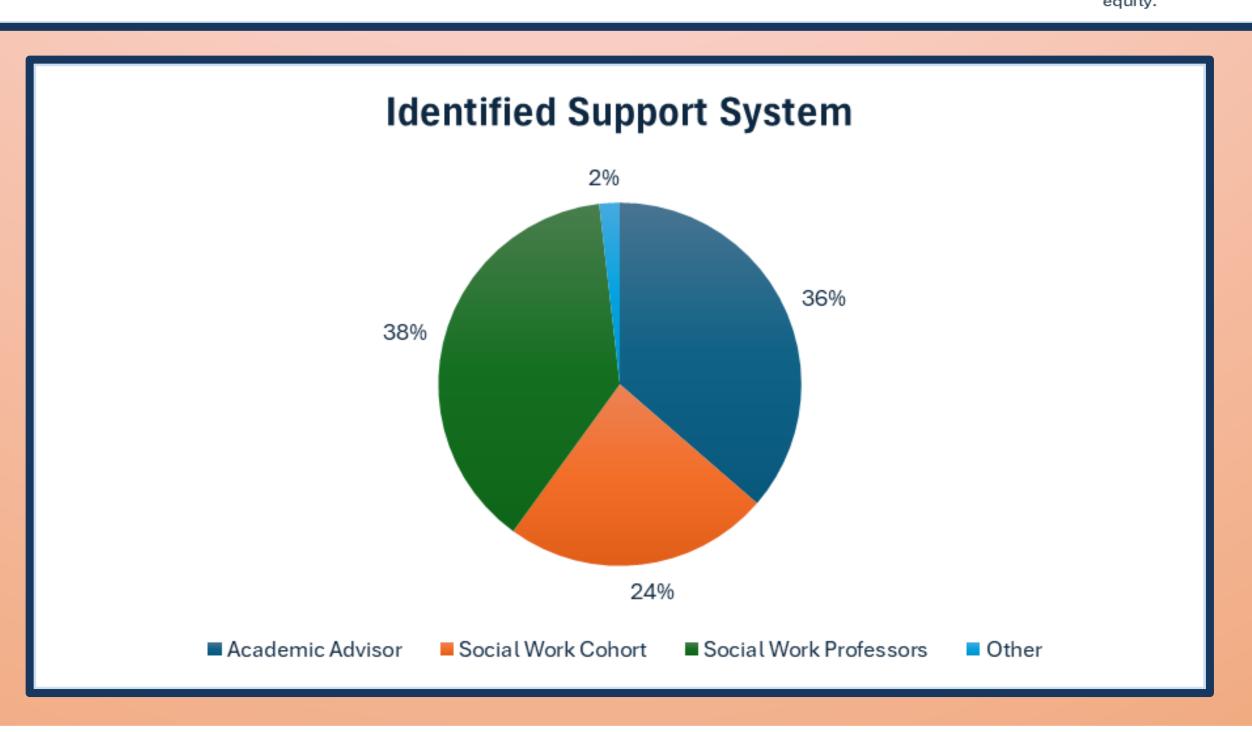

- Incrementally implement advance seminar opportunities or capstone research projects to stretch high-achieving students
- Develop an integrated student organization to focus on student engagement, events and community building
